- Zoom links and how to arrange for office hours for extra help

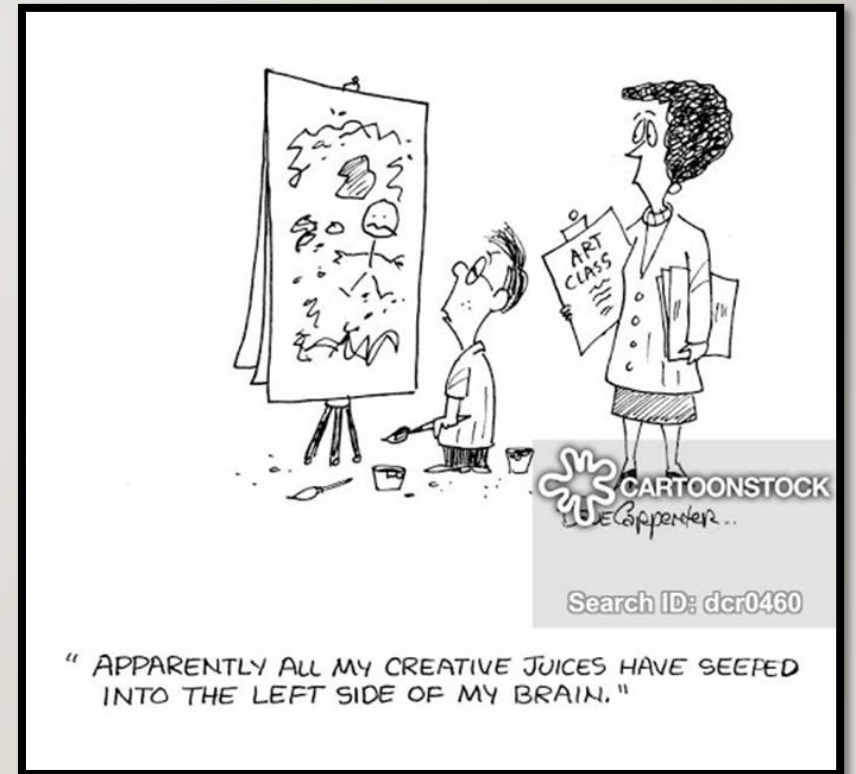
## Digital Portfolio

# GRADING

---

- Grading in the art room is not your standard assessment. Here's what we look for:
- How well directions were followed – were all components of the project met?
- Was a thorough process attempted or did they do the bare minimum?
- Critiques and verbal participation are also included when grading a project.
- Participation in the classroom and the Zoom room is also given a **full project grade** at the end of each quarter. This means that the student:
  - Showed up on time for class and the Zoom sessions, appropriately dressed, ready to work, and stayed the entire time.
  - Participated in class discussions.
  - Completed and turned in all work on time.
  - Kept a digital portfolio in a neat and creative manner.



# TURNING IN WORK

---

- In Google Classroom each project will be given a due date.
- However, sometimes I may put a date but write in the description box that it will be a progress check on that date.
- Students will be asked to show their work to the class either in zoom or in person for critiques.
- If students are not prepared for a progress check, they will be expected to share the very next class period (zoom or in person).
- If a student is not prepared again an email will be sent to the dean/parent.
- If a student misses the due date due to illness or unexpected issues, they will need to reach out to me to arrange for time to make up the work.
