
## The Temple of Learning

The feathers represent the seven continents of the world. The foam crate represents the foundation, which supports the teaches, parents, and local and global community members, represented by the pipe cleaners, who are supporting and educating the students, represented by large elevated balls. The balls on the crate represent the different elements of the SET 2.0. The various connections represent the harmony that we try to achieve, as well as the interconnectedness of our work. The different colors represent a healthy environment and diversity of all living creatures.



Centered on the Love of Learning.


Hosting the Requirements of Good Productive Lives.

These are the steps in the learning continuum that demonstrate the interconnectedness and global education that we seek for our students.



Classical Education (the three building blocks) and a Love of Learning (the heart) are at the base of our model. We then connect to children and colleagues collaborating, interdependence (the cotton balls), and STEAM (white pipe cleaners)
